Phyllis Proctor

Here's what Phyllis had to share with Alan during a recent phone interview.

Phyllis Proctor was born in Sumter, SC at Shaw Air Force Base. She was the fourth child of seven. Her family's hometown was Tampa. They moved to South Carolina, then to Michigan for seven years. After that the Roberts family (Phyllis's maiden name) moved back to Tampa.

Phyllis went to USF, earning a degree in elementary education with a certification in early childhood. Her teaching career spanned 30 years at one school, Lacoochee Elementary in Pasco County. Most of the years she taught were in kindergarten. She also taught first grade, fourth, and fifth grade. She spent a year working with kids in a reading pull-out program. Phyllis retired in 2006.

There are two people who influenced her the most. Her father, Frank Roberts, encouraged all his children to go to college. Three sisters did and became teachers. The other person who influenced her life was a Kindergarten teacher named Phyllis Long, a lady Phyllis worked with for four years. Mrs. Long taught Phyllis about the love of teaching five-year-old students. Mrs. Long is a child at heart. She always wanted to bring happiness to her students. She also looked for the most troubled children in her class and tried to improve their lives.

Phyllis has a lot of fond memories of her career. She helped students learn about the world around them. Her class created a butterfly garden. The students also enjoyed working in the trail in the woods at the school. There were ten stations teaching about nature. One of Phyllis' favorite things she did was put on a show for all the parents each month. This would let the parents know what their kids learned. It was important for Phyllis to teach at Lacoochee Elementary because her family moved to Lacoochee when she was 12 years old. That is when she knew she wanted to teach there. Not only did she work at the school, she also worked in the First Baptist Church of Lacoochee and some other churches in the area. Phyllis worked for 50 years in church service teaching children and adults. She is still helping at a church now.

Phyllis's three major interests are reading, gardening, and craft projects. She even paints! Phyllis is engaged to fellow HCREA member Alfred Lang. They have wedding plans for May. Phyllis said she would not change a thing if she had the chance to restart her career. She loved working with her kindergarten classes and hopes people will remember her for her dedication and love for the children.
